Installation

The Administrator leads the Bishop to his seat in the Cathedral and hands him the pastoral staff.

The Administrator says

I, Brett Watterson, Administrator and Archdeacon of the Diocese of Bathurst, do induct you, Mark Norman Calder into the possession of the Bishopric of Bathurst with its duties and opportunities of service.

I place you in your seat in this Cathedral of All Saints. May grace, mercy and peace from God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit be always with you.

The Administrator presents the Bishop to the congregation, saying

Brothers and sisters in Christ, I present to you, the Right Reverend Mark Norman Calder, Bishop of Bathurst

The congregation greets the Bishop with applause

Our New Bishop

Mark was born in Broken Hill and grew up in Sydney. Following ordination in 1988, he ministered in Lalor Park and North Sydney prior to his appointment as rector of St Andrew's Roseville in September 1991. He became rector of Noosa, Queensland in November 2009.

Mark and Susan celebrated 30 years of marriage in July this year.
